Hot Dog!

As we all know, the summer heat in Savannah can be brutal. With temperatures soaring into the high 90s us humans aren't the only ones struggling to stay cool. Our furry friends can also be at risk.

Ways to keep your dog cool

- Provide constant access to shade and fresh water.
- Limit exercise to early morning or late evening as the hot pavement can burn their paws.
- Cooling products like gel mats or vests.
- Use fans and spray bottles.

- Give them frozen treats like dog-safe fruits, veggies or peanut butter.
- Enjoy some fun water play with pools or sprinklers.

Signs of heat stroke

- Heavy panting
- Drowsiness
- Confusion
- Vomiting
- Excessive drooling
- Color change in gums or tongue

If your dog shows any of these signs, immediately move them to a cooler area out of the sun. Wet their coat with cool water and contact your vet.
